

**The following is a reminder and summary comparison of the two concessional licensing schemes:**

	<i>Code 404</i>	<i>C4C</i>
<i>Eligibility</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be in original or unmodified condition.</li> <li>• No less than 25 years old on application date</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can be modified with appropriate permits.</li> <li>• Manufactured 30 years prior to application date</li> </ul>
<i>Rate</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 100% exemption from vehicle licence fee and duty.</li> <li>• Reduced rate on third party insurance (except trailers).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 75% exemption from vehicle licence fee.</li> <li>• Reduced rate on motor injury insurance.</li> </ul>
<i>Conditions</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Vehicle used only relating to club events or for road test related trips within a 30-kilometre radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged or repaired.</li> <li>• Private use requires notification of an Impromptu Run to club registrar (no limit on days but run must commence and end on the same day).</li> <li>• “Historic” stickers must be affixed above or below front and rear number plates.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Vehicles can only be used for a maximum of 90 days per calendar year being: 60 days to participate in approved motoring club events; and 30 days for personal use (includes road testing, repair and maintenance).</li> <li>• Vehicle owners to record the vehicle use in a logbook prior to commencing each journey.</li> <li>• “Restricted Use” sticker must be affixed above or below front or rear number plate.</li> </ul>
<i>Notes</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Concession can be applied to vehicles (including trucks), trailers or caravans.</li> <li>• The VAA requires the vehicle be inspected to ensure eligibility.</li> <li>• The owner is responsible for ensuring the car is roadworthy and always used in a manner that complies with the requirements of the scheme.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can be applied to cars (a GVM equal to or less than 4500 kg.), motorbikes, trailers, caravans.</li> <li>• The VAA requires the vehicle be inspected to ensure modifications are in keeping with club culture.</li> <li>• The owner is responsible for ensuring the car is roadworthy, has appropriate permits for any modifications and always used in a manner that complies with the requirements of the scheme.</li> </ul>
