## Notice of Motion to make amendments to the Constitution and Rules at the AGM 8<sup>th</sup> December 2020

**Moved: Dave Currell**  
**Seconded: Keith Agar**

**I move that the Constitution and Rules of the Vintage Automobile Association of W.A. (Inc.) be amended as follows to:**

Strengthen the mental health objectives.

Amend objective e) from:

*To maintain and conduct a Club for the accommodation, entertainment and comfort of the members and their guests and to provide a club-house with amenities and to afford to members and their guests all the usual privileges, advantages and accommodation of a social club.*

to

*To provide a venue for members to get together for the benefit of the community and themselves.*

Amend objective f) from:

*To promote good fellowship.*

to

*To enhance the health and wellbeing of members by supporting and helping one another.*

Include Events Coordinator on Management Committee

Amend Section 26.1 to

*The committee members consist of —*

*the office holders of the Association (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer).*

*the Events Co-ordinator; and*

*at least one ordinary committee member.*

Clarify Section 8 (Classes of membership) rules to clarify membership particularly honorary life membership numbers.

Amend rules to:

*The Association consists of ordinary members and any associate members provided for under sub rule (2).*

*The Association may have any class of associate membership approved by resolution at a general meeting, including junior membership, senior membership, honorary membership, and life membership.*

*An individual who has not reached the age of 15 years is only eligible to be an associate member.*

*A person can only be an ordinary member or belong to one class of associate membership. An ordinary member has full voting rights and any other rights conferred on members by these rules or approved by resolution at a general meeting or determined by the committee.*

*An associate member has the rights referred to in sub rule (5) other than full voting rights.*

*The number of members of any class is not limited unless otherwise approved by resolution at a general meeting.*

*The spouse or partner of an Ordinary Member shall be entitled to the full rights and privileges of an Ordinary Member and shall not be liable for payment of additional fees.*

*The spouse or partner of a member who dies shall be entitled to assume the membership at the same class and without payment of a nomination fee.*

*Any Ordinary Member of the Association may be nominated as an Honorary Life Member of the Association by an Ordinary Member, such nomination being accepted or rejected by the Committee in line with the by-laws. The nomination shall also require a three-fourths majority of the member at the meeting of the Association,*

*An Honorary Life Member shall be registered by the Secretary, such member not being required to pay any of the Association's fees and being entitled to the full status and rights of an Ordinary Member.*

Fix incorrect references

Fix by correcting format and adding back a Proxies Section that clearly states the club does not support proxies along with references to proxy votes in associated rules:

*The Association does not provide for a member to appoint a proxy to speak or vote on their behalf.*

As mentioned elsewhere, we have committed to running the sausage sizzle at the new Bunnings Midland store on the 13th of December. This will be the first or second week of operation and promises to be busy and profitable. A bit daunting so soon after our very busy swap meet and I am sure some of our members would prefer not to see another sausage EVER! I had a very pleasing show of volunteer hands at the October general meeting and feel optimistic that we will be well supported. ## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

My tenure as President, usually for 12 months, turned into 18 months thanks to Covid 19 and social distancing. Fortunately we have had a great committee to run things while we have been unable to have face to face meetings. Brian White resigned early on and the position was filled by Keith Agar. After a short election process with Jason Ferris and Brian Tucker in the mix, Brian Brookes decided not to continue in the role of committee person and after the end of June, when we should have been having our AGM. This did enable us to persuade Pauline Velden to step back in the role as events coordinator, following the early resignation of Debbie Paine from the role. We decided that the role of events coordinator was important enough to make this an automatic member of the committee of management. This will need to be ratified along with other proposed constitution changes to be voted on at the AGM. So I urge you to read the proposed changes and vote for them should you agree.

Our finances are in good shape thanks in part to a donation of \$600.00 from Shannons who are subsidising the magazine. We had three cars given to us, a Volvo which we sold for \$1400.00, a Fiat X1/9 also sold for \$355.00 and a Riley RME as it stands, worth an estimated 3-4k. The workshop assembled a Vanguard engine for the princely sum of \$1000.00 for a non-member. Also, we had a very generous - anonymous donation of \$10,000.00... which your committee allocated to the renovation of the clubrooms.

Our members' generosity never ceases to amaze me, with the many donations for equipment for the club house renovations and of course paint. The club did not buy any of the paint for this project. Domenic was able to source some almost new carpet tiles and some of the workshop crew helped to lay them as well. Bruce Swarbrick has kindly offered to trim the Riley for us at no cost to the club, all we need to do is to provide the materials. S&S Industries have kindly agreed to supply all of the paint for the Riley. Joseph Brajkovich has given the club a sea container in gratitude for the workshop's help with the Talbot and Cynthia, our next door but one - neighbour and member, gave us a Dyson Vacuum cleaner - great for our new carpets.

Some of you may not know that all of the equipment in the workshop with the exception of the hoist, has all been donated by grateful members who have had the workshop undertake repairs to their vehicles. No money changes hands, but people who have had work done are asked to provide the workshop with something that is needed, so our asset register is growing without any cash outlay and the workshop's capability is increased.

Our club has had a really big year under trying conditions. My sincere thanks go to all those who have participated and organised events, helped to refurbish the clubrooms, worked in the workshop or arranged morning tea for the workshop crew, your efforts are very much appreciated - we really do have a wonderful club.

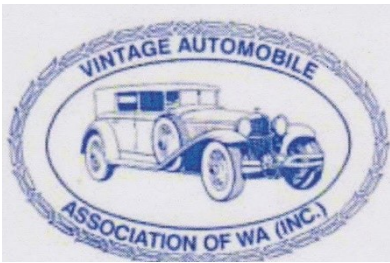

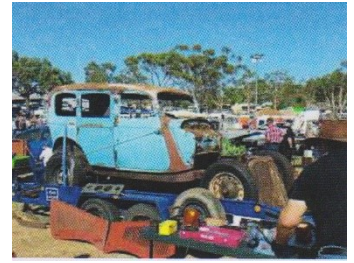
