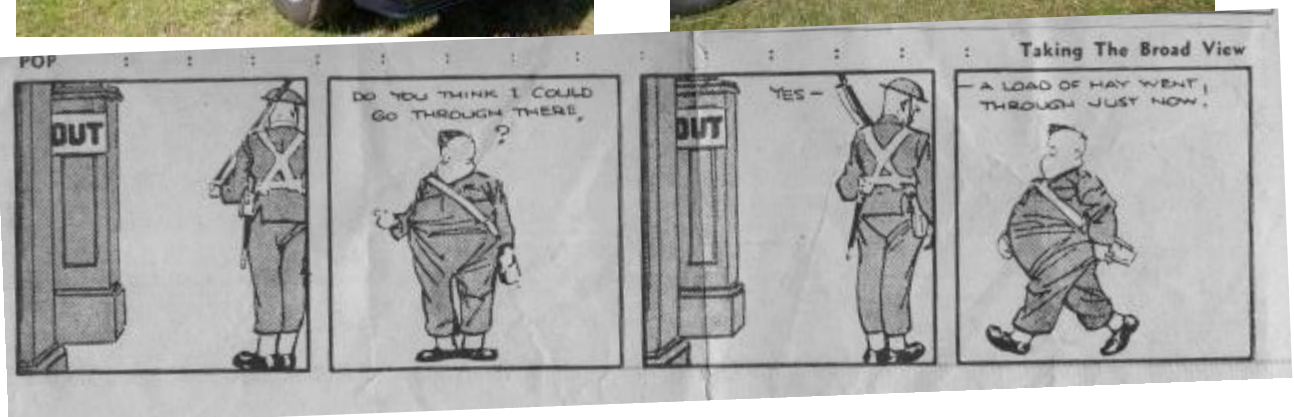

Membership fees

A general discussion was held regarding the membership fees for the 2019/20 year. It was felt that as we have not had an increase for a number of years and that the clubrooms are in need of major repairs that the annual membership fee be raised from \$60.00 to \$70.00 per annum.

Library floor

The library floor has appeared to have sunk causing one of the book cases to lean in a potentially dangerous manner. It was resolved that the Wednesday group will help Martin to remove the books to try and see what has happened.

We also resolved that we would look at what books we have and try to cull some so that we maintain books of a distinct historical or technical nature and reduce the inventory if possible.

Web page

Dave Currell gave a demonstration on some of the changes that he has made to the web page, including a form to lodge impromptu runs and a booking form for the club trailer, Dave is to seek some feedback from members and to demonstrate the changes to members at a club meeting.

Swap meet

Tony to advise members we will be setting up the site Saturday morning and to ask for volunteers both days.

Future sub committee

Sub committee members are working on trying to get some sponsorship for club shirts. They also advised that we need to maintain a register/scrapbook of events where the VAA are seen to be supporting the community in order to show various government departments that we are deserving of funding.

General business

A lengthy discussion was had regarding the make up of the Committee of management. The new constitution recognises that the executive committee should act as the committee of management making decisions for the club to function on a day to day basis, but the constitution also allows for this committee to be expanded. Various numbers were discussed, and the consensus of the current committee was that the number on the committee of management should be 11 which INCLUDES the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. This will need to be ratified at a general meeting. This number will allow for a broad cross section of members to be involved.

The next committee meeting will be held at the clubrooms at the earlier time of 7:30 on Tuesday the 4th of June

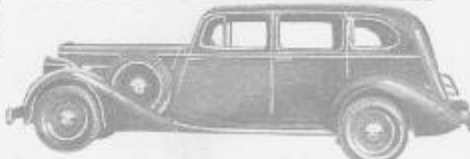

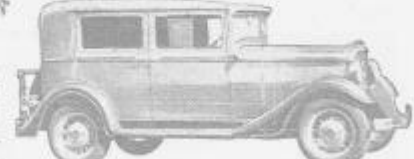
