This 1935 Ford Roadster Utility (ute) is one of only 6 manufactured in that year. Approximately 385 Utes were manufactured by Ford Australia in 1935. Of that number, only 7 were Roadster Utilities. One was #304 Well Side and six were #302 Straight Side.

Ford Utes were developed because of a 1932 letter from the wife of a farmer in Victoria to Ford Australia, asking for a vehicle to drive to church on Sunday which could also carry pigs to market on Monday. Ford designer Lew Bandt designed a vehicle based on the client's request and the model was released in 1934. A convertible version, known as the roadster utility, was produced in limited numbers, production ceased in 1938.



I purchased my 1935 Ford from VAA Life member Ron Perry. Restoration took Ron 4.5 years. The car runs a 221 cubic inch flathead V8 engine with 3 speed transmission and 600 x 16 inch tyres on 16 inch wire wheels.

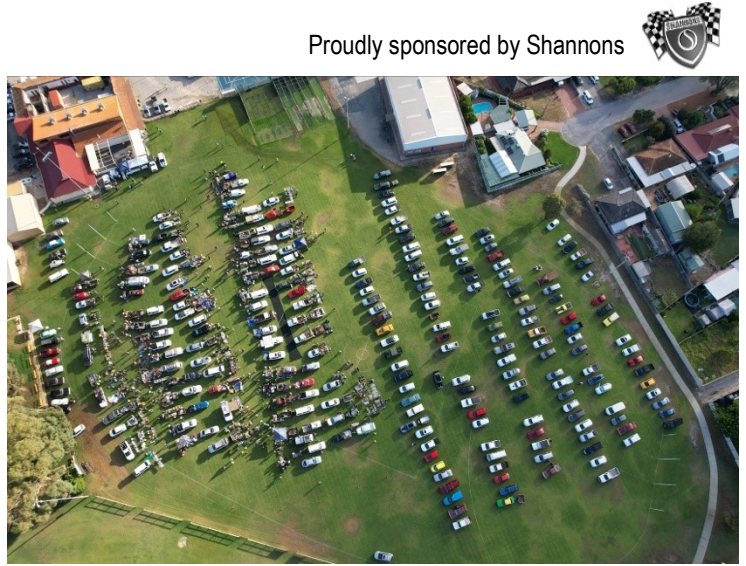
Day on the Green in the Kitchen

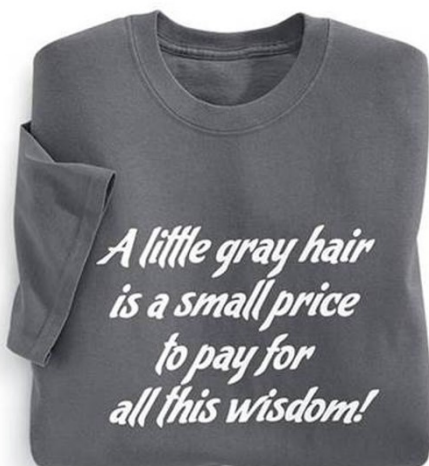

Announcement of 2023 AGM nominations

Please be advised that as per our constitution Section 32.

32. Nomination of committee members

- (1) At least 42 days before an annual general meeting, the secretary must send written notice to all the members —
 - (a) calling for nominations for election to the committee; and
 - (b) stating the date by which nominations must be received by the secretary to comply with subrule (2).
- (2) A member who wishes to be considered for election to the committee at the annual general meeting must nominate for election by sending written notice of the nomination to the secretary at least 28 days before the annual general meeting.
- (3) The written notice must include a statement by another member in support of the nomination.
- (4) A member may nominate for one specified position of office holder of the Association or to be an ordinary committee member.
- (5) A member whose nomination does not comply with this rule is not eligible for election to the committee unless the member is nominated under rule 33(2) or 34(2)(b).

Office Bearer and Committee Positions

Nominations are required by the June general meeting (13th June), this allows time to have the written nominations ready for the AGM on 11th July. Please make sure that you get the person that you are nominating to sign the form as well as yourself. Please note that once written nominations are in for various positions there can be NO nominations from the floor at the AGM for that position.

The following is a brief description of each position.

President

The president's role is to be the public face of the VAA, to chair all meetings of the VAA and to provide guidance and advice to members in general but more specifically to the committee.

Vice President

To act as the President in all functions in the absence of the President.

The Secretary / Registrar

To arrange for all incoming and outgoing correspondence to be collected and sent, to send out notices to members as directed by the constitution, President and or committee. Record minutes of all meetings. Provide information to prospective members, and current members. Generally, act as manager for the club and its assets as per the constitution. Prepare agenda for meetings as directed by the President. To maintain a list of all members and their vehicles, to provide mailing lists for the Past Times magazine to be posted. Provides a full membership list to various committee members as required. Issue CMC Form 1 to eligible members. Maintain a database to achieve the outcomes of the position. Prepare the annual register of members and vehicles to be print ready. Arrange for new member badges to be purchased and sent.

Committee of management x 6

The committee of management meet at regular intervals and manage the club on a day-to-day basis, currently meetings are bi-monthly but can be more or less frequent. Automatic members of the Committee of Management are, President, Vice President, Secretary Treasurer and Events Coordinator.

Registrar

To maintain a list of all members and their vehicles. Provides a full membership list to various committee members as required. Issue CMC Form 1 to eligible members. Maintain a database to achieve the outcomes of the position. Prepare the annual register of members and vehicles to be print ready. Arrange for new member badges to be purchased and sent.

The Treasurer

Manage the finances of the club in accordance with best accounting practice. Maintain the financial records of the club. Pay accounts in a timely manner as directed by the executive committee and or the general meeting. Provide a set of financials at the end of each financial year for examination by the membership.

Magazine Editor

The magazine editor receives information from various committee members for inclusion into the Past Times Magazine, receives articles from members and other sources as required. Constructs the layout and edits all received contributions for the Past Times to be print ready.

Publisher

Post paper copies of Past Times magazine to members each month. Print mailing label, fill postage bags with Past Times magazine and printed label ready for mailing.

Scrutineer

To examine members vehicles to be assessed for originality. Arrange for periodic inspections, provide advice generally on vehicle condition.

Assistant Scrutineer

As above see Scrutineer.

Librarian

To maintain the library in good order, chase up outstanding loan books, catalogue new donations and record the donors inside the book covers promote the library from time to time.

Club Historian

Generally, a member with a longstanding historic knowledge of the club.

Events Coordinator

Collect, collate events and advise members through the Past Times magazine and or through direct mail or email, events thus noted are then available for members to use their concessionally licensed vehicle. Note that any member can arrange an event at any time, but it is advisable to have it listed in the monthly run sheet.

Dating Officer

The role of the dating officer is to ascertain what category concessional vehicles are licensed for.

Club Caretaker

To maintain the grounds and building in a fit for purpose state from month to month notwithstanding busy bee's occurring when the workload increases. To maintain a register of all club assets and advise when replacement and or repair is required.

Raffle Coordinator

Coordinates the monthly raffle and conscripts help for tickets sold during the monthly meeting.

Kitchen Manager

This position ensures that there is tea, coffee, milk, sugar and cool drinks are available for members at monthly meetings and other times as required. Keeps the kitchen, fridge clean and well stocked.

Merchandising Manager

Purchases and manages stocks of suitable regalia for members to purchase at cost

Workshop Manager

Liaise with the Wednesday group on offers of projects from members. Acts as liaison with the owners of projects to ensure parts or sub-let jobs are available to minimise hold ups. Audits safety periodically and assesses equipment as fit for purpose.

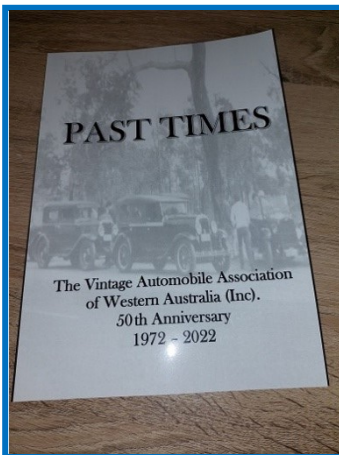
