As you can see the design changes over the years were very dramatic.











s Britain emerged from the trauma of WW11 her government realised that the country had to "Export or Starve" it was under this type of coercion and using the type of forward-thinking mind that Austin's chief had, that Leonard Lord had the Austin Major Company embark on two new projects.



An A40 Dorset/Devon

One of the projects, took Austin to Tiryberth, Bargoed in South Wales about 25km north of Cardiff where he planned on employing 60 ex-miners suffering from industry-related diseases. Intended to be a non-profit industry the men were set to work at the Austin Junior Car Factory manufacturing the J40 Roadster and a twin-cam racer (later called the Pathfinder Special).

The cars used scrap metal left over from the manufacture of full-sized cars at Longbridge. They had an opening boot and bonnet, mock-up instrument panel, working handbrake, dummy engine with real (reject) spark plugs, electric lights, a horn, and looked very like their big brothers, the Austin A40 Devon/Dorset series.

Priced at 20 pounds they were expensive at the time, being the equivalent of three week's pay for a skilled man in July 1949 when production started. Some 32,000 of these kiddie cars were manufactured between 1949 and the end of production and many of these went to overseas destinations.

Later, In Western Australia, ACCM was able to trace three restored J40 Roadsters in museum collections and there was another derelict bodyshell in a private collection. This is where Willie Siroen comes into the story.

This little Austin J40 was purchased by Willie Siroen in 1967, the same year S & S Industries was founded by Willie. Willie quickly motorised it as the car was too heavy for his kids to pedal. The accelerator, brake, clutch, and gears were set-up in the same configuration as a standard motor car. Powered by a Vespa 50cc 1 cyl, 2 stroke motor, 3 speed. Top speed 25mph.

A Story of the little Austin J40 Roadster

This little car was proudly driven for many years by Willie's four sons; Gary (now deceased), Tony, Ron and Jeff, and in later years by Tony's two sons Brent and Daniel. The boys all learnt to drive in this little car.

The 50cc engine is from a Vespa scooter, the front wheel hubs from a very rare German built TWN Triumph scooter and the rest of the modifications were made from bits and pieces he had lying around. For example, the chassis is an old bed frame, and the body is suspended from the chassis with old cylinder head valve springs.





About 6 years ago Tony (Willie's son) restored the little J40 fully. The car still runs today but is now in retirement and takes pride of place amongst Tony Siroen's (Willie's son), collection.

here are many features that have vanished over the years but the one which stands out for me is the tailfin. Moving from the darkness of the depression and WW2 into a bright, new, improved, optimistic world, the vehicle industry

was in a perfect position to blossom. The tailfin trend was driven by a fascination with jet travel, the space race and one-upmanship. Tailfins transitioned from a small bump in the late 40s, to the trends full stride of the late 50s then decreased in the 60s. By 1965 with a few exceptions tailfins were basically gone. 
