Bird in hand worth \$2m

A racing pigeon dubbed the avian world's F1 ace Lewis Hamilton has sold for a record \$2 million.

Armando was snapped up for the sky-high price

after a fierce bidding war between two Chinese fanciers. The bird — Belgium's best longdistance racer of all time — had been expected to break the previ-



ous record of \$602,000 but the final figure shocked owner Joel Verschoot.

"The two Chinese had told me in advance that they absolutely wanted Armando — but I didn't see this coming," the 63-year-old said.

Armando, aged five, is known for his exceptional sense of direction and amazing wing strength. The unnamed buyer is expected to use him to breed champions.

INTRODUCTION TO TIG WELDING

We had a good number of members take up the offer to be introduced to Tig welding kindly put on by Rob Maier. After a slight delay we got underway about 10:30 with Rob explaining how it all works. This welding is gas shielded to the welds are very clean. We were welding 1mm thick mild steel which is pretty much what your vintage cars are made from. Rob showed us how to but weld simply fusing the steel together and using a filler rod. I think everyone enjoyed the morning, by the time you read this we will have had a second session. It was interesting to note that the two best welds by beginners was from Sian Owen and Jackson Callo. There is not doubt in my mind that if you are about to cut rust out of your car the best option is Tig as there is much less heat. A big thank you to Rob Maier for his time and patience.
