Please attend one or more of the sessions if you can see below for dates and times.



Well, for those of you who did not come to this event, you really missed out!!



Ron and Dorothy Dunn also visited the Airforce Memorial Estate on Sunday March the 7th. Several other members from the club were there also.



### Workshop Stories That are (Embarrassingly) True ...

Unfortunately it's mine – As a young man consumed with a need to make his car go faster, I fitted a dash tacho (well, it looked cool anyway). Fitted it, took it for a test drive, car went great ... until I turned right at the lights! ... car dead. Scratched head. Hit it in the guts, alive!! All the way home, it kept dying when I turned right. Spitting chips, I consulted with Dad (a motor mechanic) he asked "What did you touch?"

I replied "Just fitted a tacho". Dad rolling a smoke on the back verandah asked "did you put insulating tape on the wiring joins?" "No" I replied, checking under the dash (metal) – I saw my wiring was shorting as I turned right. I had in fact installed a kill switch. Taped up the joins – all good!

A Jag/Daimler left the workshop (eventually) after work on an irritating fuel flooding problem at the carb. It had dual SU carbies and dual electric fuel pumps. The obvious, and as it turned out, wrong reasons were: too high fuel pump pressure or dicky float/needle. After putting in a fuel pressure regulator, swapping floats, new needle and seats etc etc etc - it still had the problem! Well, what was it? – why was it still flooding? The answer – the woven fuel line to the mis-behaving carb had a very small split (almost impossible to detect) which leaked when it felt like it and gave all the appearance of a flooding fuel bowl.

New piece of fuel line: - problem fixed!

To my complete delight, a club member brought his XP Sedan into the workshop, because it was running like a pig and spitting oil everywhere. As is the case with old rockets, they have been through a few owners and been 'kept going' - just not very well!

First off, the PCV system was sorted so it did not lubricate everything under the bonnet.

Second, off with the head to see if we had something major wrong. Not really, just tired, so the plan was: a quick valve job, put a thermo in and assemble the head back on top where it should be. I was just about finished helping our workshop boss put it together on the bench by managing the spring compressor on my side of the head, while he got the valve springs, collets etc organized on his side. Then - **very loud swearing** as we were nearly finished, that almost lifted the tin off the workshop roof! I looked at my upset boss – why was he so upset? We had done everything right - **except** - put the valve stem seals in!! Easily fixed – start again and lucky we picked the oversight early rather than bolt the head to the motor and **then** see the error.

Happy ending – club member very pleased and we got it done (eventually)...

## Fremantle Prison Torchlight Tour. Friday 26th March 2021

Well what a fabulous night is was. To begin with, we all met at Ciscerellos for fish and chips as, the tour was not til 9:00pm. Although that did seem late for some, once you are out of your comfort zone, it was an enjoyable evening with great company. The tour was the Torchlight Tour, appropriately named, as you entered the prison that was pitch black, with only your small torch to guide you. Lots of ghost stories to begin with , just to psych your mood for the moment, and for those who believe in ghosts , it would have had you on your toes.

Walking through the prison listening to the stories the walls of the prison held, was interesting and after the riots on the 4<sup>th</sup> January 1988, the prison was set to close 3 years later, once the new Hakea Prison was built.

Whilst the many stories were being told, there were actors along the way, that would suddenly come out or the dark cells re-enacting the days when prisoners were still there. This sudden burst had many of the girls screaming and then a laugh along with it. The prisoners certainly endure a tough time back then, as the stories that were told, certainly showed it was inhumane in that era. Although for us, I am sure, that era was only yesterday!! We have certainly come a long way and much more educated in the rehabilitation of inmates.

Fremantle Prison is iconic and is really worth a visit. Just so much history. Rate out of 10 for this adventure was 10 out of 10.

Do your self a favour - go and visit Fremantle Prison, if you haven't already done so.

This car was owned by Fred & Olive Ashby (VAA members.)


Debbie and I purchased the car and re-joined the VAA.

I have also seen a chrome plater regarding the diecast items that are by far the worse parts of brightwork that we need to have replated, he wasn't all that encouraging and we will investigate further.
