Dear Tony,

I have really enjoyed reading the history of the past 50 years of the VAA.

Naturally enough I noted with special interest the members' memoirs of the years in the old Shire depot building on the corner of Jacoby Street and Mann Street from 1976/77 and the move to the "Goat shed" at the Mundaring Recreation Ground 5 years later in about 1981 as well as the terrible loss to the Association of the "Goat shed" and its contents in the fire in 1998.

I had forgotten about the negotiations that took place with Shire staff over some 3 years with the objective of relocating the Association to Parkerville Oval; however the details in the book brought those memories back into focus.

The decision to finally purchase 19 Helena Street also brought back wonderful memories for me as my mother had worked in that building as a shop assistant when it was the local Corner Shop/Cafe for Bellevue.

The one thing that impressed me the most about the history of the Association was and still is, the incredible resilience, talent, commitment and obvious friendship amongst the members that has enabled it to overcome many difficulties to arrive at its current position in 2022.

Your 22 years or so in Mundaring, especially the conversion of the Goat shed into your initial headquarters, to the 22 or so years in Bellevue with the continuous improvements and upgrades of your current home is just a remarkable story.

The success and positiveness of the stories in the book was uplifting and a welcome change to what we have all recently experienced.

I will donate my book to the Mundaring Historical Society so your story will carry on in its archives.

So, tonight is all about having fun, so please relax have a drink and enjoy the night and the show you are about to see.

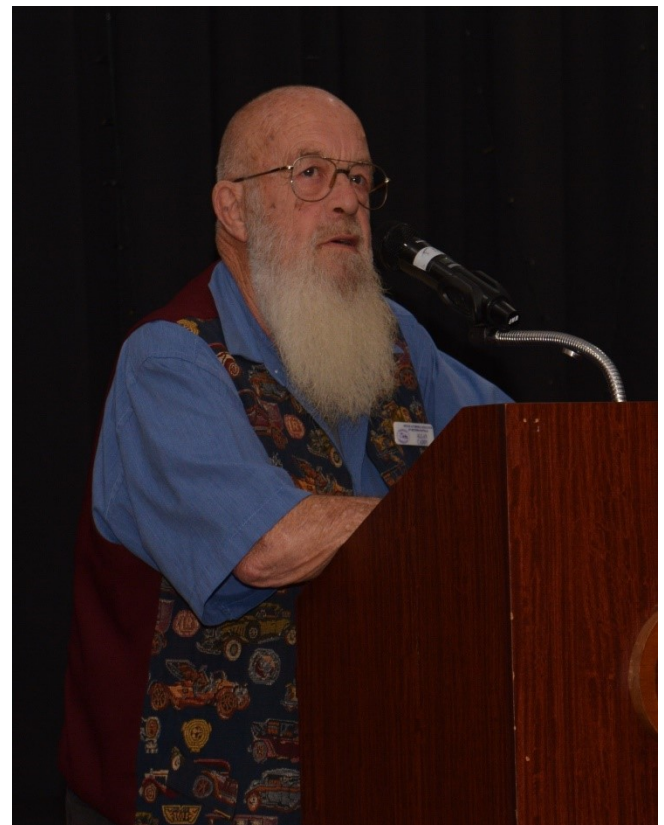

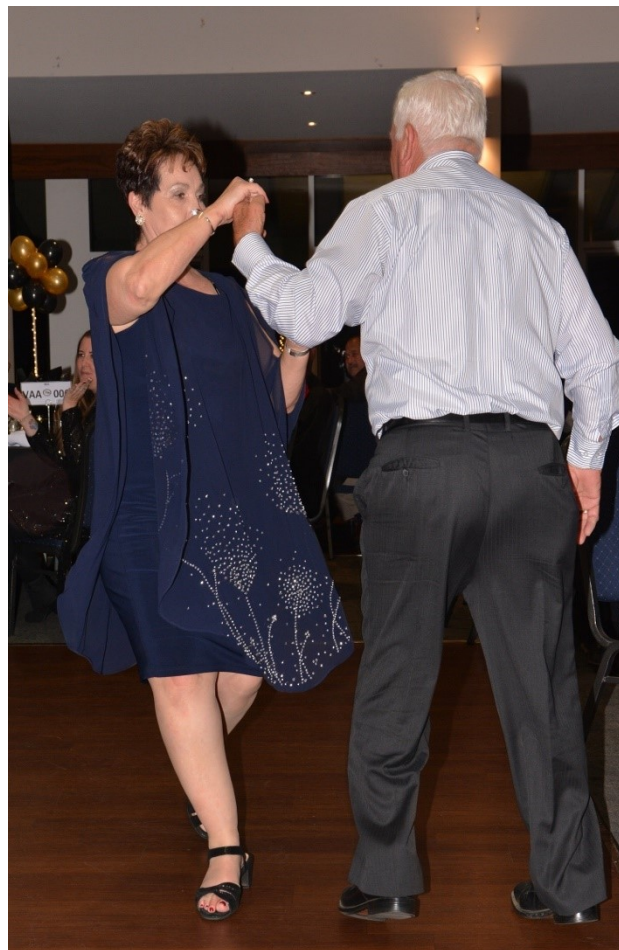

Welcome to my interpretation of fashion history. By Cheryl Glew



The 1920s are well remembered for beginning in almost hysterical gaiety, WW1 was over, the Spanish flu epidemic was coming to an end, and the Suffragette movement had achieved its goals.

By 1920s most countries of the world had granted women the right to vote. The tight boned corsets, that contorted their bodies into unnatural shapes, were gone, the restraints of dress and social standing were past. With the dawn of the 1920s there emerged a New Woman for a New Age. War had permitted women a new freedom. Women's desire for freedom and the need to express it were echoed by women designers. Coco Chanel was the designer of the decade, she designed comfortable, wearable fashion so women could work, move, and play, she also championed the little black dress.

Dark grey and browns were still dominant colours for day wear, it saves on laundering. Early 20s the dominate colour for evening was flesh, nude, or champagne. In 1922 Tutankhamun tomb was found and the love affair with Egypt introduced bright, primary Jewel colours, these mixed wonderfully with black and the Art Deco movement. Women were working, drinking, smoking, dancing, partying, wearing visible make up, some were even driving motor vehicles. Coming out of the war years, men's numbers were reduced, and a girl needed to be noticed. It was generally recognised that women had bodies and should feel no shame in displaying them, evening dresses had no backs, or sleeves, some were even almost transparent. Cigarette holders were popular to keep the smoke away from the face and hands, classes were available so a lady could learn to smoke correctly. Leisure time was active,

sport was an important social pastime, golf, tennis, and rowing were popular as was the beach. Young men and women were toned and tanned.

The 1920 silhouette was straight, square, and boyish, with shorter skirts and dropped waistline, hair was short and always adorned with hats or jewellery. The Art Deco movement was evident in 20s fashion. Ready to wear clothes were available for the 1st time. Simplicity of construction was the key look for both day and evening, but evening wear was glamorous and ornate with beading, sequins, and embroidery. Tennis wear was massively popular as day wear for both young men and women.

Fashion never stands alone; it evolves influenced by world and local events.

Short hair for WW1 working women was necessary for safety and convenience, making short hair fashionable in the 1920s. With short hair women embraced hats of every design, scarves, turbans, and hair jewellery. The pandemic made gloves a necessity to keep one's hands not only warm but also clean, restaurant and hotel service staff wore white gloves so patrons could see clean hands. As a result, ladies in the early 20s were not fully dressed without their hat and gloves.

The beach and sun worship were a popular pastime, but girls had to keep an eye out for the modesty police with their measuring tape, fines were often given out for bathers that were too far above the knee. To alleviate this problem, women started wearing beach pyjamas over their bathers. It was frowned on for women to wear pants but a little more acceptable for a day at the beach, forward women started wearing pyjama suits for resort wear and home entertaining. By mid 1920s modesty police patrol was disbanded as young women just didn't care and my guess young men enjoyed the view.

The war not only influenced women's fashion; men's wear also changed with the times. Short trousers were traditionally worn by children, it was a rite of passage to graduate to trousers as a young man. During WW1 the British cavalry officers wore breeches which bloused over their riding boots, creating a loose-fitting pant through the knee, the boots prevented the fabric snagging or dragging in the mud. When soldiers returned home wearing the sporty, casual, baggy look it became enormously popular in Britain. Trousers makers copied the look changing their patterns to balloon out over the thighs and buckle in 4 inches below the knee, this looked and felt baggier than normal trousers. Plus-fours were generally in plain colours or tweeds, but trendy fellows went for stripes, checks, or plaid, linen was popular for summer. Edward Prince of Wales introduced the fashion to the United States on a visit in 1924. Golfers liked the plus-fours and the 1920s saw the creation of golf fashion, not only did they wish to play well, but they also wanted to look dashing and stylish. They quickly adopted the plus-fours which were not only high fashion, but the extra bagginess and length offered them more room and freedom of movement. The fashionable golfer wore his plus-fours with argyle knee socks and a pullover sweater. The popularity of plus-fours declined in the mid-1930s, however they never quite disappeared from the golf scene, the early 1980s saw a revival of plus fours by American golfer Payne Stewart, who wore them throughout his career



1920s started with so much happiness and potential and ended with misery and despair when in 1929 the stock market crashed, and the world was plunged into depression. Next month I will explore fashion of the 1930s.

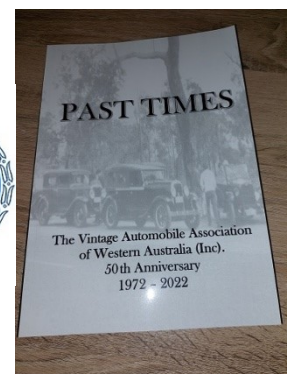
