JAGUAR MK7 1957

A four door luxury saloon car produced by Jaguar Cars of Coventry from 1951-56. In 1952 it became the 1st Jaguar to be made available with an optional automatic transmission. A tested MK7 in 1952 had a top speed of 100mph (163 km/h) accelerated from 0-60 mph (97kmh) in 13.7 seconds and returned 17,6 miles per imperial gallon.

The test car cost 1693 pounds including taxes with 30,969 produced 1950 -1956 Jaguar thought it would find most of its customers overseas, however it went into production just as Britain's post-war economic recovery began to ease, with enthusiastic reception in both British and USA markets. Petrol rationing ends, nearly ten years after it was introduced during W.W.2.

The novel 'A Town Like A Alice' by Neville Shute is published. Robert Menzies was Prime Minister.

The Television Act is passed by Parliament, setting regulations for the broadcast of television in Australia, although TV transmissions did not commence until 1956. The first town to fluoride the water supply in Australia was Beaconsfield, Tasmania.

This was done just after the busy-bee by:

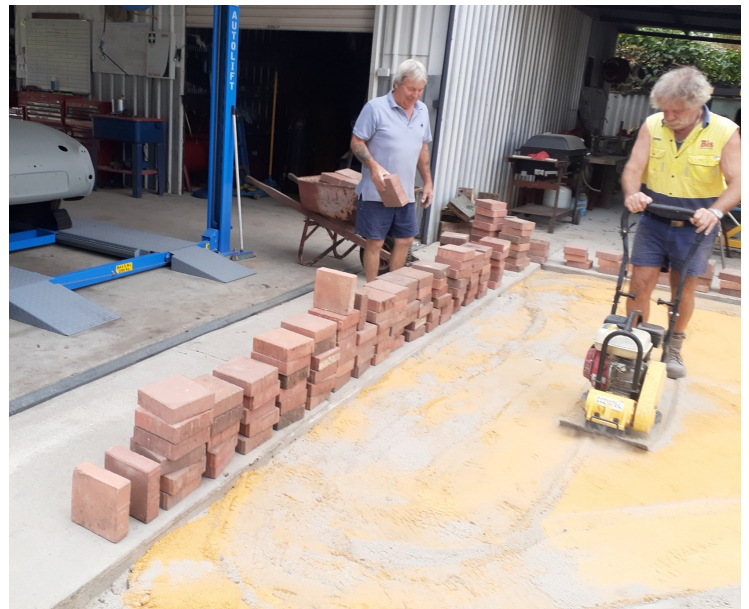

Code 404 Concessional License Update

Our members have over four hundred vehicles on **Code 404 license saving many dollars a year in licensing fees and also Insurance charges.**

The Department of Transport (DoT) were seeking to make significant changes to the scheme to align it with C4C.

The good news is that the Council of Motoring Clubs (CMC) have successfully negotiated: no changes to the scheme at this stage.

However, the following are **important** points of clarification.

1. *Impromptu Runs*

Impromptu Runs must be registered prior to run and the information required clarified as:

Date, approximate start and finish time of run, starting address, Intended Destination, Finishing address, members name, vehicle registration number and drivers name (if not the member).

The form on our website

file:///C:/Users/Dave/OneDrive/VAAWA%20Files/VAAWebsite/impromptu_run_form.html

has been updated and please include these details if you notify the registrar by email, message or phone call.

2. *Ensure information is accurate*

DoT audits showed that members buy or sell vehicles, swap engine and license plate numbers without notifying the Registrar. Hence the annual return provided by the club does not match DoT records. **Please ensure our register contains the correct details for you and your concessional registered vehicle** (i.e., match the license papers). Contact Dave on 0419 998 589 or dave.currell@iinet.ne.au to check.

3. *Identifier Labels*

Code 404 concessionally licensed vehicles must display an identifier label attached to, but not obscuring, each number plate. The club has compliant "Historic" stickers and plates available.

4. *Financial Membership*

You must be a financial member of the club, or your vehicle is not licensed or insured. The club is required to advise DoT of any members with concessional licensed vehicles who have not paid their fees by 1 July.

Code 404 is a privilege that is generous compared to other States and entirely your responsibility to meet its requirements. Please remind yourself of the requirements included in the guidelines

There will now be regularly audits by DoT and failure to comply risks the scheme for yourself, fellow club members and the owners of over 10,000 vehicles across 140 clubs.
