From the Secretary & Registrars Desk

Hi Everyone.

The year kicked off with a very pleasant annual breakfast at Whiteman, Much cooler this year and great to see many classics present. Thank you Tony, Brian, Loris and cooks on the day.

It was a pleasure to accept new members Russell and Leslie McChesney with their 1956 Buick Special and John and Jonina Della Bosca with their 1976 Monaro GTS at the January meeting. Welcome and we look forward to seeing you at the monthly meeting and some events. We already have two nominations for February and five vehicles have moved to concessional license.

On the subject of concessional licensing, the Minister for Transport, Rita Saffioti and Premier, Mark McGowan issued a media statement during the month announcing a new concession scheme for classic cars. There has been a lot of conjecture going on about what this means to the existing Code 404 licencing under which our vehicles can obtain concessional licencing. It is early days and the Council of Motoring Clubs (CMC) who represent and negotiate Code 404 on behalf of the Clubs and staff within the Department of Transport are awaiting more information. It is our understanding that the announcement relates to a separate system which does not affect the Code 404 process at all. The CMC has asked that Clubs or individuals not to make separate approaches to the Minister or to the Department but rather allow them to meet with the Minister and his advisers with a consolidated voice. CMC will advise once they have informed information. Rob Hyde is our Club delegate who attends CMC meetings and if you have some matter to contribute please do so through our club and Rob as our delegate.

On a very sad note, the Club offers its condolences to the family and friends of Dr John Teasdale on his recent passing. John has been a member of our club for over 10 years and had a wonderful collection of 30 cars registered with the Club.



Flashback to 24 October 1956 a consignment of FE Holden's was exported to Singapore from Fremantle. Launched in 1956, the FE also came in a new station wagon body style which was dubbed "Station Sedan" In sales literature. In the same year, Holden also began exports to Malaya, Thailand and North Borneo. In 1957, Holden's export markets grew to 17 countries including Indonesia, Hong Kong, Fiji and South Africa.
