#### Monthly mug winner


This monthly mug winner was Damien Hollis, assistant raffle coordinator and a valued member along with his family of the VAA.

#### The Trials and Tribulations of getting a Classic across the Nullabor

I wanted to share my experience of getting a classic across the Nullabor on freight. A simple enough operation you would have thought, as in the past I have transported most of my worldly possessions from the UK. In comparison, this should have been a breeze from one state to another within Australia.

It all started when I found my dream car a Daimler 1965 2.5 V8. After lots of searching locally and Australia–wide, I eventually found one located in Sydney owned by the President, Tony of Dapto Classic Car Club. After lots of emails, dialogue and photos, we agreed on a price and the deal was sealed.

I then started the process of sorting transport for my newly acquired little beauty. The first thing that struck me was the variance in price, ranging from \$1,200 to 10,000. Then there seemed to be three options road, train or sea. A lot of different companies on the web, seemed to have the same software for online quoting and seemed to be proxy companies to larger companies in the background. After hours of deliberation, checking reviews and doing my due diligence, I finally decided to go for a mid-range quote. I wanted it to go by road, as this seemed to be the easiest option, drive on one end and drive off the other.

I called the company concerned and explained that I wanted it to go by road and behind the cab, so my queen of the desert could be protected from stone chips. I was told that the boot had to remain empty for insurance purposes, which was a shame as I had two heads that were included in the sale. Customer service at the transport company assured me this would leave by road and would arrive roughly two to three weeks after pickup.

The day finally came for pickup and I alerted Tony of their impending arrival. After collection, he sent me a photo and informed me after speaking with the driver, that it was going by ship not by road as per my instruction!

I then phoned customer service to talk about the mistake. I was subjected to the rigors of trying to rectify, which seemed to be harder than scaling Annapurna in a blizzard!

I gave up in the end with the usual response from customer service to file a complaint, which usually gets filed in the too-hard bin!



In the end I decided to go with the flow for the sake of my blood pressure. The car was transported at the Ceva yard, Minto, NSW for shipping (Ceva Transport, seemed to be the company that my original freight people were using).

Fingers crossed I would have my Daimler delivered in a few weeks. The next morning, I received a call from the yard, "the car won't start! You need to get a mechanic here!" Me "Is it battery or mechanical?"

Yard "Don't know, you need to sort out or we will charge you storage."

Faced with the problem of trying to get a mechanic/Auto Sparkie in NSW and the chance that this may happen at every stage of the trip, I decided that I needed to change the mode of transport. I did find out at a later stage that there was nothing wrong with starting the car. The owner had left a note on the steering wheel to push on the foot brake while pushing the start button. (This was not a great help if the person loading cars was not able to read English).

I then started looking on the web again for road transport and found an article on Carsales about interstate transport. At the end of the article, there were various recommended companies. I gave one of them a call and they said that they would pick it up from the Sydney freight yard. I had to pay the money upfront as with the original company, no COD in this game! All done over the phone, no paperwork involved.

I would have to pay a cancellation fee deducted on my original payment to the transport company.

At this stage, I was up for double for transport and was worried about getting the refund. Now having got my Daimler back on course, I felt settled knowing that it was now on a truck, winging its way to Melbourne and then onto Perth. Of course when I looked for online tracking there was none! I did notice in the search results, a warning from Queensland ACCC about the company that had my car. The Queensland Government had issued a warning not to deal with this company for breaches of consumer law, for taking consumers' money and not receiving the services. The directors had also been involved in a dodgy dating agency, scamming 3 million dollars from customers and were featured on Current Affair!

I now felt that had gone from the frying pan into the fire, money outlaid to two companies, not sure if I would retrieve my Daimler and asking myself "how much is this going to cost?" I decided to phone the company and see if I get my money back.

On speaking with the original young lady that I had booked through and airing my concerns, she told me that they were under new management. The company had agreed with the Queensland Office of Fair Trading to guarantee their services in exchange for their trading license not being rebuked.

I sheepishly agreed to carry on with them and promised a 5-star review if I received my car. Two week later I received a call from this guy saying that he was on his way to deliver my car. He informed me he used to be a street fighter and had nearly laid the guy out prior to delivery for hassling him. (Note to self, do not annoy this person).

In the end I got the car, the refund and submitted a five-star review, all was right in the world knowing I finally had it in my garage at home.

I think next time, I will get a trailer and bring it back myself o Dean






