A busy end to the year with the Christmas lunch, meeting and the Christmas lights run put on by the Daimler car club, happy to see so many of our members join in with not only the Daimler club but also the Triumph club and the Riley car club I think in all we had well over 20 cars looking at the lights which were spectacular, they get better each year.

Changes to the club register have slowed up somewhat but some people are letting me know of changes which is great as this will help as we move into 2018. I am turning CMC form 1's usually within 24 hours plus post but please remember that we do need confirmation that the vehicle has not been modified before I can issue a CMC form 1.

If you are using a club AIS inspector please make sure that you attend his registered place of inspection as they are not permitted to make house calls the Department of Transport have very strict rules on this. We also have some volunteers who can help you check your vehicle before your inspection if you need help and remember you can get a permit to move a vehicle online so it is quite easy to move even an unlicensed vehicle. If you use a club AIS inspector your vehicle can only be put on a concessional licence, if you want to go onto a full licence later you will need another inspection, if however you use a mainstream inspection station you can have either full or concessional but if you choose to go for a concessional licence you can swap to a full licence at a later date if you with without having another inspection.

The Ford Jail Bar Truck is at the motor trimmers so the Wednesday crew can have all of January off to work on their own projects. We do hope to have the truck ready for Brad to take home late in February or very early in March with most things done except wiring which Brad is having done in Brookton. Our two retired carpenters have done well with the tray so far and we only need to bolt it down fully and provide headboard timber and rope rails. Brad had the exhaust done just before Christmas so the truck is sounding really nice.

The VAA concessional license procedure

This document applies to new members and existing members and is intended to explain the correct procedure to get your vehicle onto a concessional licence.

To be eligible for a concessional licence you MUST be a financial member of the club, new members will need to complete a membership application form and pay the annual or pro-rata fee plus a once of nomination fee of \$50.00, our current annual fees are \$60.00 per annum.

Once you are a financial member you are then eligible to gain a concessional licence for your car, motorbike or truck.

If your vehicle is already licensed you do not need to have it inspected.

If your vehicle is NOT licensed you will need to get it inspected. You may choose to have it inspected by a car club inspector, however if you do this and want to move it onto full licence at some stage it will need to be re-inspected by a mainstream inspection station. The authorised person inspecting your vehicle will provide you with a document showing that it has passed inspection, you need to take this with you to the licensing centre.

We will need to complete a CMC Form 1 and have it signed by the club registrar, the CMC form 1 confirms that your vehicle is a minimum of 25 years old and is in original/un-modified condition. We have five members authorised to inspect your vehicle for originality they are, Graeme Barton 0409 880 378, Ray Roberts 0438 911 387, Brian White 08 9295 1619, Ron Devenish 0427 085 419 and Tony Warner 0417 555 073, please note that there is NO charge for this service You will also need to complete an E81 form which is from the department of Transport, this form needs to be countersigned as per the listing on the reverse side, or you can get the officer serving you at the licensing centre to witness it for you.

It is wise to take your club membership card with you although it is not a legal requirement, it is almost certain that you will need to have proof of ownership if the vehicle is currently unlicensed. So, make sure you have a copy of your receipt with you.

Once you have your vehicle licensed you still have two more things to do, firstly notify the Registrar of your number plate and secondly put a historic sticker or plate to both the front and ear of your vehicle.

Please note that while annual inspections are no longer mandatory you are responsible for maintain your vehicle in roadworthy condition always. Concessional licenses come with some conditions please make sure you are fully familiar with the rules contained in the Code 404 booklet, these are available online at the CMC website or in hard copy from the club.
