We formed an events committee, which worked tirelessly throughout a two-year period steered by Loris Cooper, with help from too many people to mention here. That committee is still running to this day.

I have lost count of how many members cars we have helped over the past few years. The skills we have as a club is staggering, there is not much we can achieve when we put our minds to it.

We had what is now an annual event, our Big Morning Tea for the Cancer Council. The events team collected a little over \$3,000.00 this year for this very worthwhile cause.

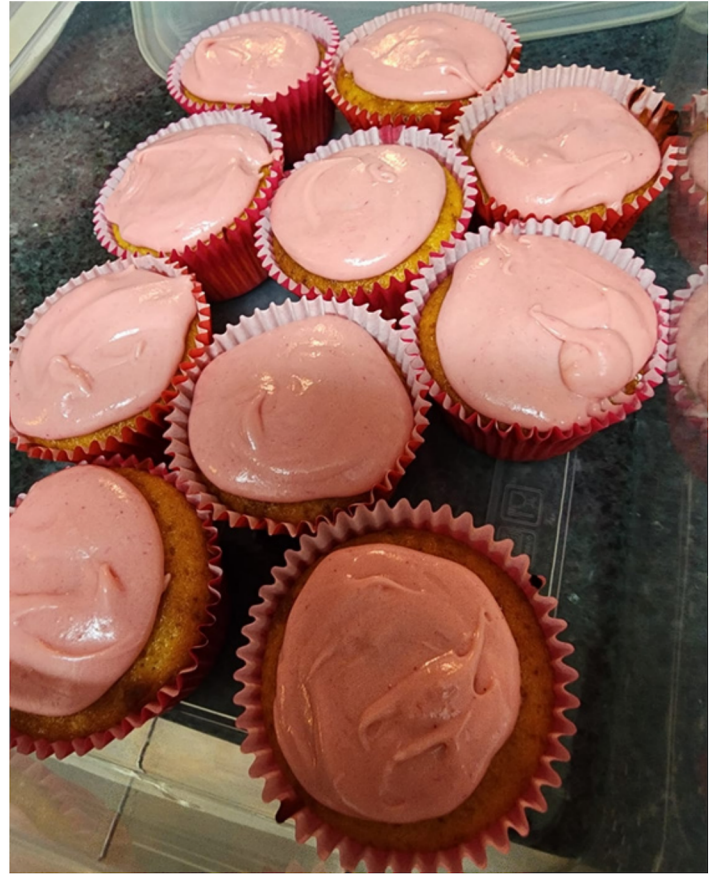

Lunch at Longriders Cafe and Restaurant at 2 pm. Pop on board the Hotham Valley Steam Ranger train ride, if not, simply have a wander around Dwellingup and through the museum while you wait for the train's return or head home.

Run details:

Meet at 8:00am at McDonalds, Jull Street, Armadale. Depart at 9:00am (sharp). Trip time 2hrs.

Destination: Longriders Café and Restaurant,

Dwellingup for a lunch stop before catching the Hotham Valley steam train at 2pm.

Train Departure Point:

Marinup Street, Dwellingup, Directly behind the Dwellingup Trails and Visitor Centre

The Journey:

Upon departing Dwellingup the pace is leisurely as the train rolls along westward, down to Isandra Siding, 14kms away. Once there, the locomotive will move to the opposite end of the train during the 20-minute stopover and make ready for the return.

On the return journey, you will thrill to the magnificent sights and sounds of a steam locomotive hard at work climbing Western Australia's steepest and most spectacular section of railway, through the Darling Range Escarpment as the train returns you to Dwellingup.

Travel along an amazing portion of steeply graded and tightly curved railway manually carved into the Darling Range and the agricultural areas of Dwellingup and beyond.

Mobility: Passengers with disabilities, special needs, or restricted mobility are welcome to travel with Hotham Valley Railway provided that where necessary they have a person accompany them who is capable of providing any assistance they may require. Please note train journeys involve the use of steps to board and alight from the carriages with very narrow doorways.

Steam Rangers have a Licensed Cafe Car serving various refreshments.

The Steam Ranger is Pet Friendly! But only in cars 1 and 5.

We'll kick off at 6.00 pm and you can stay as long as you like.

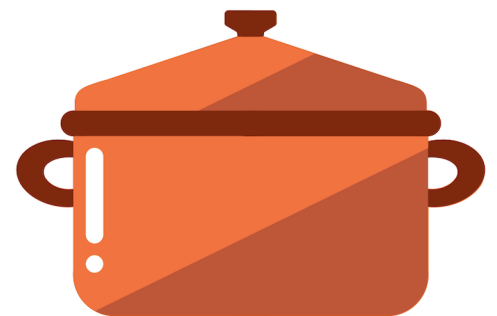
All you have to do is turn up with your favourite Casserole Dish.

President *

To be the public face of the VAA, to chair all meetings of the VAA and to provide guidance and advice to members in general but more specifically to the Committee of Management. To ensure appropriate insurance cover is in place for all aspects of the club's functions.

Signatory to bank accounts.

Vice President *

To act as the President in all functions in the absence of the President. To assist the President as and when directed by the President.

Secretary *

To manage all incoming and outgoing correspondence and provide information to members as required. Collect mail from PO Box. Record minutes of all meetings. Prepare agendas and record minutes for General Monthly and Committee meetings. Maintain hard copy filing system and record copies of documents on the club's computer. Maintain record of internet access details of the various businesses. Print mailing labels for postage of Past Times Magazines to members.

Signatory to bank accounts. Maintain a club Key Register, issue and retrieve club keys as necessary.

Registrar

Provide membership application information to prospective members. Advise current members with licencing information regarding their vehicles. Enter and maintain members details onto club database. Arrange for new member badges to be purchased and sent with welcome letter. Provide a full membership and vehicles lists as required. Issue CMC Form 1 and C4C to eligible members. Issue annual membership renewal invoices and maintain record of fee payment on MYOB. Provide a set of financial statements at the end of each fiscal year for the examination by the membership. Signatory to bank accounts.

Events Coordinator *

To source and collate potential events and present to Events Committee for further discussion and formalising with dates/times/details. Issue agendas and record minutes from Events Committee Meetings. Maintain VAA Event Calendar, updating monthly and providing a copy to Webmaster and a copy to the Past Times Editor for inclusion in monthly magazine. To utilise/delegate the Events Committee Members in the planning and running of the Club's Annual Swap Meet.

Committee of Management Member *

To participate on the committee in making decisions on the management of, and affairs of, the club, taking reasonable steps to ensure that the club complies with the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 the Constitution and Rules of the Club and by-laws (if any).

The Committee of Management consists of; the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Events Coordinator plus six (6) additional club members. The Committee meets bi-monthly.

Magazine Editor

To receive articles from Committee Members. To receive articles from club members and other sources, for inclusion in the Past Times Magazine which is produced monthly. Constructs the layout and edits all received articles to 'print ready' stage. Copy for articles must be with the Magazine Editor by COB last day of the current month. Forwards copy for printing to printers in time for magazine to be printed in the first week of new month.

Scrutineer

To examine members vehicles to be assessed for originality. Arrange for periodic inspections, provide evidence generally on vehicle condition.

Assistant Scrutineer

To assist Scrutineer in the examination of vehicles requiring assessment for originality and assist with periodic inspections.

Librarian/Club Historian

To maintain the club library in good order, chase up outstanding loan books, catalogue new donations and record the doners details inside the book cover, promote the library from time to time.

To maintain a knowledge of and document the key people and events that occur in the club. Generally held by a member with a longstanding historic knowledge of the club.

Publisher

To prepare latest edition of Past Times magazines ready for post, by way of placing magazine and cover sheet into plastic sleeves. Taking magazines to post office.

Building Manager

To arrange and manage major maintenance and improvements to the clubroom and grounds. Coordinate busy-bee activities.

Club Caretaker

To maintain the grounds and building in a fit for purpose state notwithstanding busy bee's occurring from time to time. To maintain a register of all club assets and advise when replacement and or repair is required. To issue and/or retrieve club keys and to maintain a key register. Arrange for any additional keys to be cut.

Raffle Coordinator

To coordinate the monthly meeting night raffle and conscript the help required for sale of tickets on monthly meeting nights. Oversee purchase of three (3) appropriate raffle prizes.

Kitchen Manager

To ensure that there is tea, coffee, milk, sugar, water and cool drinks available for members at monthly meetings and other times as required. Purchase of BBQ supplies of sausages, bread and condiments for club meeting nights. Assist BBQ Cook with sausage sizzle requirements. Keep the kitchen area and fridge clean and well stocked. Set out supper table on club monthly meeting nights. Assist Raffle Coordinator in the purchase and preparation of raffle prizes.

Club BBQ Cook

To cook sausage sizzle for monthly club meetings.

Merchandising Manager

To purchase and manage stocks of suitable regalia and memorabilia for members to purchase at cost.

Workshop Manager

To coordinate the activities of the Wednesday and Saturday workshop sessions. Liaise with members and workshop participants to assess and schedule workshop projects. Maintains safety procedures. Monitors safety procedures are followed and audits equipment safety periodically and assesses that equipment as fit for purpose,

Webmaster

To maintain the club's website: <http://www.vaawa.org.au/> and Facebook page with latest events, magazines and club information ensuring all content remains relevant and up to date.

CMC Delegate

To represent the club at Council of Motoring Club meetings, be the contact point and keep the committee and members informed of relevant information.

Welfare Officer

To monitor the general health and welfare issues of members, in a private manner.
