Given that the mercury soared to 40+ during the day, I guess that was to be expected.

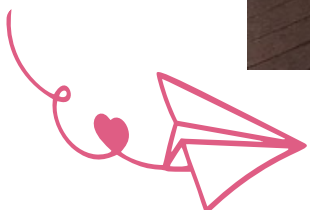
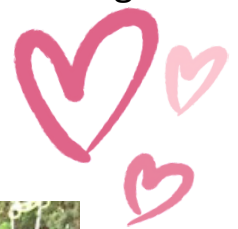
16 in total, club members and invited guests were welcomed by the Club Events Coordinators.

The Mk 2 Ford Escort was produced from 1974 until 1980 it had three engine sizes a 1.3, a 1.6 and a 2000cc single overhead camshaft engine. In a two door form it excelled as a rally car winning many championships.

It is still rallied today in historic events. The rally version ran a Cosworth 1600cc engine. The car had success with the following drivers, Roger Clark, Timo Makinen, Bjorn Waldegard and Hannu Mikkola. Robert's vehicle has had a bare chassis re-build.

It has vented front brake discs, a 2000cc Pinto engine with twin Webbers and an aluminium sump with pacemaker extractors. Robert converted a five speed Sierra gearbox to fit his Escort.
