

Our Club, over the past few years, has been given several cars. Thinking about this recently, I recall Rob Hyde and I going to City Beach to pick up a Wolseley which we took back to the club, This pick up was really tricky, as we had to pull it out of a undercroft garage. The next car we were given was a Commodore sedan, which was a runner ,but quite rusty. Again ,this was picked up by Rob Hyde and this time Trevor Holmwood was the helper.

Dave Currell, as Secretary took a call from a guy in Busselton who wanted to give away a Riley RMB. so the workshop crew drove to Busselton and picked the car up. This was subsequently restored and sold to a club member. The next donation was two cars. One was a Fiat X19 and a Volvo. The Volvo was sold on and the Fiat was purchased by Loris Cooper and is under restoration.

Next came along the Toyota Camry donated by Kath and Keith Agar. This car was painted and prepared for sale with a huge amount of work done by the workshop and Troy De Brenni subsequently sold on and has been seen around our neighbourhood.

John Orr, another member, has donated a Rover P5 sedan, which is in the yard as I write this. The current plan is to get it concessionally licensed and offer it up as a rolling restoration to club members. This car is also a runner.

A couple of weeks ago I received a phone call to see if we wanted two rolling chassis, complete with engines, gearbox, and a mountain of parts for a 1926 Chevrolet. It took about eight of us to pick this all up. The building was about to be locked up, as the proprietor was going into receivership. We have put these out to tender to club members.

By my calculation we have made approximately \$13,490.00, with the Rover still to be sold.



3 tips on how to improve workshop safety

Improving safety is high on the agenda in most workshops. This makes perfect sense, since a dedicated focus on improving safety standards, not only helps workshops ensure the well-being of their employees and customers but is also a sound economic investment.

So, how can you reduce the number of potential hazards and raise safety standards in your own garage? We have collected 3 operational tips to consider.

1-USE THE RIGHT TOOLS

Tip number 1 doesn't really require any further explanation. But okay, let us expand on the safety benefits of using the right tools.

If mechanics are using tools for anything other than their correct purpose, they not only risk breaking the tools and the vehicle they are working on but may also harm themselves and /or others.

2-CLEAN UP AFTER YOURSELF

- ... Your mother doesn't work here. We all know this expression, which is used to encourage people to keep things in order and the message very much applies to workshops too. This is because tidiness is a key factor in raising workshop safety standards. It:
- Eliminates a trip hazard
- Means that you always know where to find the tools you need, making it easier for to perform your repair work safely


Keeping things in order improves workshop efficiency as no one needs to go around playing hide-and-seek with tools they cannot find. So, go out and organize all your stuff.

3-LOOK AFTER EACH OTHER


We often do repair work on our own, for example underneath a car. And what happens when nobody is watching what you are doing?

Experience tells us that sometimes we work alone to do repair work that we should not be preforming on our own. We are simply being too bold – probably because nobody is watching, and it is a bit too inconvenient to ask for assistance.

Unfortunately, such behaviour significantly increases the risk of accidents. Therefore, it is a good idea to look after each other and create a mutual understanding of the importance of abiding by the safety rules.





	. The idea would be, that we have 100 shares worth \$2000.00 each so if	
	100 members loaned the club shares at \$2000.00, raising \$200,000. we would be able to get a loan for the remainder. Some members may be	
	able to loan more than one share. Any contribution made would be a	
	loan, but it is not certain at this stage how long the loan would be for but if members fall on hard times all efforts would be made the pay out the	
	loan.	
	-If we were successful in purchasing this property, we may be able to	
	sub-divide the rear block, keeping it for parking and sell the house to pay back all the members loaned funds.	
	- A motion was moved by Dave Currell, to attempt to purchase this	
	house and that the Committee of Management be authorised to proceed,	
	on behalf of the members, to place an offer and to negotiate a purchase	

	price not to exceed \$415,000. - The motion was seconded by Keith Agar - Motion carried unanimously. Actions: - Tony Warner to send an email be sent to all members, to see how many members would be willing to make a loan to the club. - Further building structure inspections to be carried out by Domenic Paoliello and Robert Hyde. • Jamie and Beth Perry extended their thanks to the VAA Members for all their support and caring on the passing of Ron.
