Defibrillator

What is a defibrillator you ask? Well let me tell you. It was with great pleasure to be able to source Lifepak Defibrillator for the club. At around \$2000 each they are not cheap, but more importantly they are lifesaving tool. As a qualified first aider a defibrillator is a must have these days.

No it's not used for jump starting old cars, it is a sophisticated life-saving device used to treat Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA), a condition that occurs when the heart unexpectedly stops pumping due to an underlying medical condition. If you do use a Defibrillator within the first few minutes of sudden cardiac arrest, it can increase the survival rate to as high as 70%. Therefore, it is vital that more people become aware of what Defibrillators are, how to find them and how to use them. An AED analyses the heart rhythm and recognise an abnormal rhythm, or 'ventricular fibrillation'. It will then decide whether a shock is required to be delivered or not. A Defibrillator delivers a set amount of electrical shock to the heart after it analyses the heart rhythm. It determines whether a shock is required to the heart via adhesive electrode pads attached to the person's chest. The shock then interrupts the chaotic rhythm of the heart and gives the heart the chance to return to its normal pumping rhythm.

So how does ours work? Very easy.

- Push the on/off button
- Listen to the voice commands

If unsure just follow the pictures.

That's it, very simple and lets's hope we never have to use it!
