Mark Atkinson was 18 in 1971 when he bought his first car, a Frog eyed Austin Healey Sprite, he paid \$495.00 for BLZ 558.

Mark laid the car up in his father's garage in November 1972 (about the time the VAA was being formed) due to carburation and electrical issues.

It stayed laid up in Newcastle NSW until 1998, when Swan towing transported it to his brother in law's house in West Swan, where it stayed until Mark dragged it out and took it to the VAA clubrooms in March 2021.

In the past 18 months Mark with help from Trevor Holmwood, Bob D'Jong, Rob Popiel, Mark Sweeney, Alan Warner and others (but it is fair to say that Mark did most of the work himself.) repaired and worked on the car to this condition.

It is interesting that coincidentally it has been off the road for almost the same time that our VAA club has been running.

Well done Mark, I am sure that you and Deborah will have many years of enjoyment with this little gem of a car.

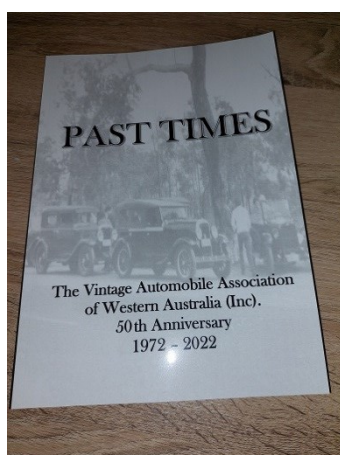
